

Contaminated / (Damaged) Mutilated Canadian Bank Note(s) Claim Form

Damaged bank notes fall into one of the following categories:

Contaminated notes could be harmful to one's health or safety because they have come into contact with toxic substances (e.g., blood, mould, drugs, and unknown substances).

Mutilated notes show signs of excessive damage from fire or water, missing pieces, or other forms of deterioration. These notes are likely too damaged or brittle to be used for payment or must be specially examined to determine their value.

Form Completion Instructions

- 1. This claim form is for mutilated/ (damaged) or contaminated Canadian Bank Note(s) only. Coins and foreign currencies will not be accepted.
- 2. Each claim must be submitted using this claim form. Bank note(s) must be submitted with the completed claim form.
- 3. A claim may be submitted by an individual or a company/corporation.
- 4. Individuals completing the form must complete sections A, B, C and F. Note that claims over \$1,000 require individuals to provide proof of identification as described in section E.
- 5. Financial Institutions or armoured car courier companies may submit claims on their own behalf or on behalf of a client.
 - i. Financial Institutions or armoured car courier companies that submit claims on their own behalf are only required to complete sections B, C, D and F.
 - ii. Financial Institutions or armoured car courier companies that submit claims on behalf of a client must complete sections A, B, C, D and F. Note that claims over \$1,000 require confirmation that proof of identification has been verified. See section E for acceptable forms of proof of identification.
 - iii. Claims submitted by a Financial Institution should be sent on collection.
- 6. Other Companies or corporations that submit claims on their own behalf are required to complete sections A, B, C and F. A contact name and telephone number from the company or corporation must be provided for correspondence purposes.
- 7. All claims must be submitted to: Bank of Canada, Mutilated Note Service, 234 Wellington Street, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, K1A 0G9
- 8. An acknowledgment letter will be sent once the claim is received at the Bank of Canada.
- The Bank of Canada, its directors, officers, employees, or other representatives shall not be liable for any costs related to this claim or for any damage to the bank note(s) that may occur during processing.
